# Staff Report 58

### LESSEE:

California Resources Production Corporation

# **PROPOSED ACTION:**

Acknowledgment of a Quitclaim Deed for negotiated subsurface (No Surface Use) Oil and Gas Lease No. 8694

### AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:

Oil and Gas Lease No. 8694 contains 13.86 acres of tide and submerged land in the bed of Georgiana Slough, Sections 19 and 30, Township 4 North, Range 4 East, Mount Diablo Baseline & Meridian, Sacramento County, California (see Exhibits A and B, attached).

# BACKGROUND

On October 20, 2022, the Lessee submitted a lease quitclaim deed (Exhibit C, attached) pursuant to Public Resources Code section 6804.1<sup>1</sup> which relinquishes the Lessee's full interest in State oil and gas lease No. 8694, so long as the lessees' obligations have been fulfilled and there are no outstanding defaults or breaches of the lease at the time the quitclaim deed is filed. This document, dated October 19, 2022, surrenders to the State all the Lessee's right, title, and interest in and to the leased lands. Staff has reviewed the lease and found no outstanding default or breach of the lease at the time the quitclaim deed was filed.

# STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION:

The Commission authorized the negotiated subsurface oil and gas lease No. 8694 (Lease) to Towne Exploration Company LP (Towne) (<u>Item 82, June 26,2006</u>). This lease was part of a pooled unit (North Isleton 30-1 Unit), which produced natural gas from a well located on private land adjacent to State lands. The Commission received royalty payments based on its unit participation and the draining of natural gas from the State's mineral interest. The negotiated subsurface lease included 13.86 acres, more or less, of tide and submerge lands in the bed of Georgiana Slough in Sacramento County, California.

Under the terms of the Lease, the Lessee was required to pay an annual rental of \$35 per acre (\$490 for 13.86 total acres), pay a royalty of 20 percent on produced gas, and maintain a performance bond in the amount of \$10,000.

On May 10, 2007, the Commission approved a partial assignment of an undivided 40 percent interest in the Lease to Capitol Oil Corporation. Towne retained an undivided 60 percent ownership interest in the Lease and continued to be the operator (<u>Item 86, May 10, 2007</u>). Capitol Oil Corporation was an exploration and production company that entered into an Area of Mutual Interest agreement with Towne.

On September 20, 2013, the Commission approved assignment of Towne's undivided 60 percent interest in Lease No. 8694 to Vintage Production California LLC (Vintage) (<u>Item 105, September 20, 2013</u>). Vintage was a subsidiary of Occidental Petroleum Corporation, a multinational corporation.

In June 2014, Capitol Oil Corporation, the holder of the 40 percent interest, assigned its undivided right, title, and interest to Vintage. Vintage thus became the holder of the full 100 percent interest in the Lease. This action was not presented to the Commission. In October 2016, Vintage's name was changed to California Resources Production Company.

A review of the Commission's files and those of the California Division of Geological Energy Management (CalGEM) confirms that no wells were drilled on or into the leased lands, no default payments exist on the Lease, and that the Lessee has complied with all applicable laws and Lease provisions and has paid all rentals.

On October 20, 2022, the Commission's Long Beach office staff received the Quitclaim Deed for State Oil and Gas Lease No. 8694 (Exhibit C, attached). This document was dated October 19, 2022, and surrenders to the State all the Lessee's right, title, and interest in and to the leased lands described in the attached Exhibit A.

### AUTHORITY:

Public Resources Code section 6804.1.

#### PUBLIC TRUST AND STATE'S BEST INTERESTS:

Public Resources Code section 6804.1, and lease paragraph 29, permit the Lessee to make, at any time, a written quitclaim of all rights under the lease. The quitclaim is effective when it is filed with the State subject to the continued obligation of the Lessee and its surety to pay all accrued rentals and royalties and to abandon all wells drilled on or into the leased lands. Consistent with Public Resources Code section 6804.1, because no lease obligations remain outstanding, staff recommends that the Commission acknowledge receipt of the quitclaim deed. The lease quitclaim does not negatively impact the Public Trust needs and values at this location, and in fact frees up the leased land for future Public Trust uses. The proposed action is consistent with the Public Trust Doctrine and is in the best interests of the State.

### **CONCLUSION:**

The Lessee executed a quitclaim deed releasing all rights, tittle, and interest in the lease effective as of October 20, 2022 (date of filing), the filing date of the quitclaim deed. Staff recommends acknowledgement of the quitclaim deed.

# **OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:**

- 1. This action is consistent with the "Meeting Evolving Public Trust Needs" Strategic Focus Area of the Commission's 2021-2025 Strategic Plan.
- 2. Acknowledgement of a quitclaim deed is not a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act because it is an administrative action that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

3. No default payments currently exist on the lease, and the Lessee has complied with all applicable laws and lease provisions.

# **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

It is recommended that the Commission:

### PUBLIC TRUST AND STATE'S BEST INTERESTS:

Find that the acknowledgment of the quitclaim deed filed October 20, 2022, will not substantially interfere with the Public Trust needs and values at this location, at this time; is consistent with the Public Trust Doctrine; and is in the best interests of the State.

#### **AUTHORIZATION:**

- 1. Acknowledge receipt of a quitclaim deed filed on October 20, 2022, for Oil and Gas Lease No. 8694, wherein the Lessee surrenders to the State all of its rights, title, and interest in and to the leased lands described in the attached Exhibit A.
- 2. Release California Resources Production Company from any remaining obligations under Oil and Gas Lease No. 8694 accruing after October 20, 2022, the filing date of the lease quitclaim deed.

A parcel of tide and submerged land in the bed of Georgiana Slough situate in Sacramento County, California, said parcel being more particularly described as follows:



Such quitclaim and relinquishment is subject to the continued obligation of the Lessee to make payment of all rentals and royalties theretofore accrued, to place all wells on the lands, or in the zones or horizons to be quitclaimed or relinquished, in a condition of abandonment in accordance with the terms of the Lease and all applicable state, local, and federal regulations, and to comply with all other terms and obligations of the Lease. Such quitclaim and relinquishment does not release Lessee from any liability for breach of any obligation of the Lease with respect to which the Lessee is in default at the time of filing the quitclaim.
