An act to add section 1.25 to an act entitled "An act granting certain lands and salt marsh and tidelands of the State of California, to the city of Oakland," approved March 22, 1909, relating to the use and transfer of parts of such lands to the State of California for State militia purposes.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

New section

SECTION 1. Section 1.25 is hereby added to the act cited in the title hereof, to read as follows:

Sec. 1.25. The city, acting by and through its city council and board of port commissioners, may give or grant to the State of California, or its appropriate agency or authority, such part of the tidelands, salt marsh and submerged lands described herein, located in the city of Oakland between Third Avenue and the channel leading to Lake Merritt from the San Antonio Estuary and between East Eighth Street and the existing tracks of the Seventh Street line of the Southern Pacific Company, whether filled or unfilled, as shall be required to construct, operate and maintain structures, facilities and yard space for the use of the National Guard, and other State militia purposes, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by the city and the State, or its agency or officers having authority therein; provided, that upon the cessation of the use of such lands by the State, or its agency or proper authority, or their successors, for the purposes herein set forth, such lands shall revert to the city subject to the uses, purposes and conditions in this act originally provided.
