## CHAPTER 577

An act to amend Section 17 of the San Diego Unified Port District Act (Chapter 67 of the Statutes of 1962, First Extraordinary Session), relating to the San Diego Unified Port District.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 17 of the San Diego Unified Port District Act (Chapter 67 of the Statutes of 1962, First Extraordinary Session) is amended to read:

Sec. 17. The term of each commissioner shall be for four

years, except as provided in this section.

The terms of the commissioners appointed by the City Councils of the Cities of Coronado and National City, and the terms of two of the commissioners appointed by the City Council of the City of San Diego shall commence on the 3rd day of January 1965, and on the 3rd day of January every four years thereafter.

The present terms of the commissioners heretofore appointed by the City Councils of the Cities of Chula Vista and Imperial Beach, and one of the commissioners heretofore appointed by the City Council of the City of San Diego shall expire the 2nd day of January 1967. The terms of the successors of said commissioners shall commence on the 3rd day of January 1967, and on the 3rd day of January every four years thereafter. The commissioners appointed by the City Council of the City of San Diego shall so classify themselves by lot so that their terms shall conform to the provisions of this section.

Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the city council of the city from which the vacancy has occurred. Any appointment to fill a vacancy during the term of a commissioner shall be for the unexpired term. Each commissioner, before entering upon the duties of his office, shall take and subscribe the oath as provided in Section 1360 of the Government Code of the State of California, and a certificate of the same shall be filed with the city clerk of the city from which the commissioner shall have been appointed, and a copy of which shall be filed with the district. A commissioner may be removed from the board by a four-fifths vote of the city council which appointed such commissioner.
