CHAPTER 171

An act to amend Sections 17 and 72.5 of the San Diego Unified Port District Act (Chapter 67 of the Statutes of 1962, First Extraordinary Session), relating to the San Diego Unified Port District.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 17 of the San Diego Unified Port District Act (Chapter 67 of the Statutes of 1962, First Extraordinary Session) is amended to read:

Sec. 17. The term of each commissioner shall be for four years, except as provided in this section.

Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the city council of the city from which the vacancy has occurred. Any appointment to fill a vacancy during the term of a commissioner shall be for the unexpired term. Each commissioner, before entering upon the duties of his office, shall take and subscribe the oath as provided in Section 1360 of the Government Code of the State of California, and a certificate of the same shall be filed with the city clerk of the city from which the commissioner shall have been appointed, and a copy of which shall be filed with the district. A commissioner may be removed from the board by a majority vote of the city council which appointed the commissioner.

SEC. 2. Section 72.5 of the San Diego Unified Port District Act (Chapter 67 of the Statutes of 1962, First Extraordinary Session) is amended to read:

Sec. 72.5. Unclassified and classified services.

(a) Employment in the district shall be divided into the unclassified and classified service.

(b) The unclassified service shall include:

(1) All officers of the district.

(2) All department and division heads.

(3) The principal assistant or deputy of all officers and department and division heads.

(4) All assistant and deputy attorneys.

(c) The board shall establish a classified civil service which shall include all positions not specifically included in the unclassified service; provided, however, any incumbents in the positions included in the unclassified service presently in the classified service shall remain in the classified service until the respective positions are vacated by the incumbents.

(d) Officers and employees appointed by the board may be removed from office by the affirmative vote of the majority of the members of the board.

(e) All persons in the classified service shall be appointed by and

may be removed by the port director subject to the civil service rules and regulations of the district.
