- Plugging and Abandonment of All Oil and Gas Wells
- Removal of Equipment
- Completed June 2021

- Feasibility Study (Completed August 2022)
- CEQA Analysis (Preparation of the EIR In Progress)
- Commission Certification of the EIR and Approval of a Specific Project



## **Feasibility Study**

- Draft Feasibility Study was released on March 17, 2022, for a 60-day public comment period
- Majority of the public comments indicated support of leaving Rincon Island and the causeway in place
- Final Feasibility Study was released on July 21, 2022
- On August 23, 2022, the Commission approved staff's recommendations for selection of a proposed project to be analyzed in an EIR



#### Retention of Rincon Island

In August 2022, the Commission voted to exclude complete removal of Rincon Island from analysis in the EIR.








#### **Tribal Collaboration**

Although the Project does not include proposals for future use, staff is collaborating on a letter of intent with the Coastal Band of the Chumash Nation for potential comanagement opportunities that support our shared stewardship of the land and resources.

## **Proposed Project**

The Draft EIR analyzes the **proposed Project**, which would include:

- Removal of structures and remediation of contaminated soil on Rincon Island
- Retention of the causeway in its current configuration
- Decommissioning of onshore pipeline connections
- Improvements on the SCC Parcel
- Remediation of the Onshore Facility



#### **Potential Environmental Impacts**

- Aesthetics
- Air Quality/Greenhouse Gas
- Biological Resources (Marine & Terrestrial)
- Cultural and Tribal Resources
- Geology and Coastal Processes
- Hazards and Hazardous Materials
- Hydrology and Water Quality
- Land Use and Planning
- Noise

- Recreation
- Transportation / Traffic
- Utilities and Service Systems
- Wildfire
- Other:
  - Cumulative Impacts
  - Growth-Inducing Impacts
  - Climate Change and Sea Level Rise
  - Commercial and Recreational Fishing
  - Environmental Justice



#### **Project Alternatives**

In addition to the proposed Project, the DEIR analyzes several Project alternatives\* including:

- Reefing
- Partial Causeway Removal
- Abutment and Revetment Retention
- Offshore Disposal
- No Project (Required under CEQA)

\*Some alternatives are included despite the potential for increased environmental impacts in order to provide the Commission, other responsible agencies, tribes, and the public with a thorough understanding of the tradeoffs of other alternatives that could be considered.

- Rincon Island Causeway Marine Biological Survey Report (Padre 2023)
- Roosting Bird Survey Report (Padre 2023)

Release of Draft EIR (60-day public review)	March 15, 2024
Public Meeting	May 2, 2024
End of 60-day public review period	May 15, 2024
Commission Action on Final EIR & Project 2024 (at Public Meeting)	3 <sup>rd</sup> or 4 <sup>th</sup> Quarter



#### **Examples of Comments**

- Address specific components of the analysis regarding significant environmental impacts or proposed mitigation by providing substantive comments that point out errors, inconsistencies, or data omissions.
- Provide references, evidence, or other factual support for the comment; or
- Are objective comments instead of personal opinion. While submitting personal views on the proposed project is not prohibited, these types of non-substantive comments may not receive a specific response in the Final EIR.
