Society for the Conservation of Bighorn Sheep


PROPOSED ACTION:

Revision of Rent.

AREA, LAND TYPE, AND LOCATION:


Figure 1. Location

2.5 acres, more or less, of school land located in a portion of Section 16, Township 2 South, Range 18 East, SBM, in the Granite Mountains, near Blythe, Riverside County (as shown in Figure 1).

AUTHORIZED USE:

Continued use and maintenance of two existing rainwater catchment basin systems (as shown in Figure 2).

TERM:

20 years, beginning February 21, 2014.

CONSIDERATION:

The lease provides that Lessor may modify the rent periodically during the lease term. Pursuant to this provision, the staff has conducted a review of the rent under this lease and recommends that the rent be revised from \$125 per year to \$239 per year, effective February 21, 2025.

OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION:

- Approval or denial of the revision of rent is a discretionary action by the Commission. Each time the Commission approves or rejects a revision of rent, it exercises legislatively delegated authority and responsibility as trustee of the State's Public Lands as authorized by law. The Lessee has no right to a new lease or to renewal of any previous lease.
- On February 21, 2014, the Commission authorized a 20-year General Lease Other (<u>Item 58, February 21, 2014</u>), to the Society for the Conservation of Bighorn Sheep. On December 3, 2018, the Commission authorized a revision of rent (<u>Item</u> <u>68, December 3, 2018</u>) from \$79 to \$125 per year, effective February 21, 2019.
- 3. This action is consistent with addressing the challenges and opportunities described in the Commission's 2021-25 Strategic Plan to "Embrace and safeguard multi-benefit School Lands and resource management stewardship that equitably balances responsible local and regional economic development, supports living wages, environmental protection, and revenue generation."
- 4. Approving the revision of rent is not a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act because it is an administrative action that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

Authority: Public Resources Code section 21065 and California Code of Regulations, title 14, sections 15060, subdivision (c)(3), and 15378, subdivision (b)(5).

It is recommended that the Commission:

Approve the revision of rent for Lease PRC 4910 from \$125 per year to \$239 per year, effective February 21, 2025.
