There is inclosed a copy of easement granted by the United States to the State of California for a right-of-way for California State Highway No. I over a strip of land comprising approximately 13.15 acres lying within and adjacent to the boundary of the Branch U.S. Disciplinary Barracks at Lompoc, California. Records of this Department indicate that the easement area was formerly a portion of Camp Cooke over which the Secretary of War accepted the exclusive jurisdiction ceded by the State, in a letter to the Governor dated 8 January 1943. The Government desires to relinquish its jurisdiction over this road easement area in order to permit the State to exercise unquestioned law enforcement thereover.

Accordingly, notice is hereby given, pursuant to Public Law 87-852 approved 23 October 1962 (76 Stat. 1129; 40 U.S.C. 319) and as provided in the easement grant, that the United States relinquishes to the State of California any and all jurisdiction had by it over the area of the inclosed easement, effective upon acceptance thereof or by proceeding in such manner as the laws of California may provide. THIS EASEMENT is granted subject to the following provisions and conditions:

- 1. The construction, use, and maintenance of said road or street, including culverts and other drainage facilities, shall be performed without cost or expense to the United States, under the general supervision and subject to the approval of the officer having immediate jurisdiction over said premises.
- 2. The grantee shall at all times maintain said road or street in good condition and shall promptly make all repairs thereto needed to preserve a smooth-surface highway.
- 3. Any property of the United States damaged or destroyed by the grantee incident to the use and occupation of the said premises shall be promptly repaired or replaced by the grantee to the satisfaction of the said officer, or in lieu of such repair or replacement the grantee shall, if so required by said efficer, pay to the United States money in an amount sufficient to compensate for the loss sustained by the United States by reason of damages to or destruction of Government property.
- 4. The use and occupation of said lands of the United States for the purposes authorized by this instrument shall be subject to such rules and regulations as the said officer may prescribe from time to time in order to properly protect the interests of the United States.
- 5. The United States shall in no case be liable for any damages or injuries to the said road or street which may be caused by or result from any operations undertaken by the Government, and no claim or right to compensation shall accrue from such damages or injuries.
