This land is located at Fort Ord, California, and was acquired by the County of Monterey for the improvement of Blanco Road.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey has accepted the deed in accordance with our Streets and Highways Code; therefore, I, Ronald Reagan, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power vested in me by Section 77.5 of the California Streets and Highways Code, hereby accept the retrocession of concurrent legislative jurisdiction by the United States to the State of California over the area described in the attached easement.

Dear Governor Reagan:

There is inclosed a copy of Easement No. DACA05-2-68-23 granted by the United States to the County of Mentercy, California, for a right-of-way for a public road over a strip of fee-owned Government land comprising a portion of Fort Ord, a U. 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vested in him by Public Law 87-852, approved by Act of Compress, 23 Cetaber 1962 (76 Stat. 1127), hereby grants to the County of Monterey, a political subdivision of the State of California, hereisafter designated as the grantes, an easement for a right-of-way for a road or street over, across, in, and upon lands of the United States at Port Ord, California, a military reservation, as described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part hereof, and as shown in red on Exhibit "B," attached hereto and and made a part hereof.

THIS EASEANN is granted subject to the following provisions and conditions:

- 1. The construction, use, and reintenance of said road or street, including culverts and other declinage facilities, shall be performed without cost or expense to the United States, under the general supervision and subject to the approval of the officer having immediate jurisdiction over said presides.
- 2. The grantee shall at all times maintain said road or street in good condition and shall promptly make all repairs thereto needed to preserve a smooth-surface highway.
- 3. Any property of the United States desaged or destroyed by the grantee incident to the use and occupation of the said premises shall be promptly repaired or replaced by the grantee to the satisfaction of the said officer, or in lieu of such repair or replacement the grantee shall, if so required by said officer, pay to the United States money is an amount sufficient to compensate for the loss sustained by the United States by reason of desages to or destruction of Covernment property.
- 4. The use and occupation of said lands of the United States for the purposes authorized by this instrument shall be subject to such rules and regulations as the said efficer may prescribe from time to time in order to properly protect the interests of the United States.

- 5. The United States shall in no case be liable for any desages or injuries to the said road or street which may be caused by or result from any operations undertaken by the Covernment, and no claim or right to compensation shall accrue from such denoges or injuries.
- 6. The United States recovere the right to make such connections between the road or street havele cutherized and roads and streets on said leads as the Chief of Englagers may from time to time consider necessary, and also reserves to itself rights-of-way for all purposes across, over, and/or under the right-of-way hereby granted; provided, however, that such rights shall be used in a manner that vill not create unaccessary interference with the use and enjoyment by the grantee of said right-of-way for highway purposes.
- 7. It is to be understood that this instrument is effective only insofar as the rights of the United States in the property over which the said read or street is to be extended are concerned, and that the grantee shall obtain such permission as may be necessary on account of any other existing rights.
- 3. All or say part of such right-of-way herein granted may be torminated by the Secretary of the Arry for failure to comply with any or all of the terms or conditions of this great, or for non-use for a two-year period or characteristic of rights greated herein. Termination shall be given by written notice given to the grantee, or its successors, or assigns. The termination shall be effective as of the date of such notice.
- 9. It is understood that the provisions of Conditions Not. 1 and 5, supra, chall not obrogate or interfere with any agreements or considerate made or outcred into between the grantee and any other agency of the United Otates with regard to financial aid to the grantee in connection with the construction, maintenance, or repair of the road or street described herein.
- 10. The United States shall not be responsible for designs to property or injuries to persons which may arise from or be incident to the use and occupation of the said precises, nor for demages to the property of the grantee, or for injuries to the person of the grantee (if an individual), nor for damages to the property or injuries to the person of the grantee's officers, agents, servants, or employees, or others who may be on said premises at their invitation or the invitation of any one of them, arising from or incident to governmental activities, and the grantee shall hold the United States harmless from any and all such claims.
- 11. The United States shall not be responsible for demages to property or injuries to persons which may urise from or be incident to the construction, maintenance, and use of said road or street.
