CHAPTER 96

An act relating to jurisdiction over lands in the Kings Canyon State 1943. National Park and to add Section 119 to the Government amended Code, relating to the jurisdiction over said lands.

[Approved by Governor April 7, 1943. Filed with Secretary of State April 7, 1943.]

In effect August 4,

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

Section 1. Exclusive jurisdiction shall be and the same is Cession of hereby ceded to the United States over and within all of the over Kings territory which is now or may hereafter be included in those Canyon National several tracts of land in the State of California set aside and Park land dedicated for park purposes by the United States as "Kings Canyon National Park"; saving however to the State of Califorma the right to serve civil or criminal process within the limits of the aforesaid park in suits or prosecutions for or on account of rights acquired, obligations incurred, or crimes committed in said State outside of said park; and saving further to the said State the right to tax persons and corporations, their franchises and property on the lands included in said park, and the right to fix and collect license fees for fishing in said park; and saving also to the persons residing in said park now or hereafter the right to vote at all elections held within the county or counties in which said park is situate; provided, however, that jurisdiction shall not vest until the United States through the proper officer notifies the State of California that it assumes police jurisdiction over said park.

SEC. 3. Section 2 of this act shall take effect only if a Gov- Effect 1943, ernment Code is enacted by the Legislature at its Fifty-fifth th 134 Session, and in such case, at the same time as the Government Code takes effect; at which time Section 1 of this act is hereby repealed.
