(d) Grand jurors and all trial jurors in the superior court, for each day's attendance six dollars (\$6), and fifteen cents (\$0 15) for each mile actually traveled, in going only. The judge of the court shall make an order directing the auditor to draw his warrant in favor of the juror for the per diem and mileage and the treasurer shall pay the warrant.

CHAPTER 1446

An act to add Section 405.5 to the Code of Civil Procedure, relating to fees for filing first papers.

In effect September 7, 1955 [Approved by Governor June 29, 1955 Filed with Secretary of State June 30, 1955.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 405.5 is added to the Code of Civil Procedure, to read:

405.5. Whenever a person files a first paper in any civil action or proceeding, he shall pay to the clerk of the court at least the applicable fee prescribed by Sections 26821, 26826, 26827, 71665, 71665.5, 72055, or 72056 of the Government Code. The clerk shall thereupon file the paper and if any additional fee is required by law shall notify the party by mailing notice postage prepaid to the address stated by the party, and if the balance of the fee required is not paid within 20 days thereafter, the filing shall be ineffective for all purposes. The recital of the giving of notice and nonpayment of the fee in the certificate of the clerk shall be prima facie evidence of the facts recited therein.

CHAPTER 1447

An act to repeal Section 113 of the Government Code, relating to criminal jurisdiction.

In effect September 7, 1955 [Approved by Governor June 29, 1955 Filed with Secretary of State June 30, 1955.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 113 of the Government Code is hereby repealed.
