(formerly Hanson Marine Operations Inc.), Lind Marine Inc., and Suisun Associates (collectively, the Applicants), have applied to renew leases and related permits that would allow them to continue mining sand for 10 years following the end of the regular 10-year term. Mining occurs in Central San Francisco Bay, Middle Ground Shoal, and within the navigation channels of Suisun Bay. The purpose of this sand mining is to obtain marine aggregate, which is primarily used for construction purposes within the greater San Francisco Bay Area.



PROJECT SUMMARY Martin Marietta Marine Operations, LLC. (Martin Marietta) (formerly Hanson Marine Operations Inc., a Heidelberg Cement Group affiliate),

Lind Marine Inc. (Lind), and Suisun Associates (collectively, the Applicants) hold leases issued by the CSLC to harvest sand commercially (sand mining) within the San Francisco Bay-Delta estuary. The CSLC is considering granting new leases of California sovereign lands (at the existing lease parcel sites) to the Applicants for an additional 10-year period. The leases, if granted, would allow the Applicants to continue mining sand within the lease area boundaries. The Applicants propose to mine a combined volume of 1,630,000 cubic yards per year from the CSLC parcels and 120,000 cubic yards per year from private parcels in Suisun Bay. The existing leases overlay sovereign lands under the jurisdiction of the CSLC: PRC 709.1 (Presidio, Alcatraz North, and Point Knox North Shoals); PRC 2036.1 (Point Knox South); PRC 7779.1 (Point Knox Shoal); PRC 7780.1 (Alcatraz South Shoal); and PRC 7781.1 (Suisun Bay/Delta). The Applicants have applied to the CSLC to reissue these leases to authorize commercial mining of sand for 10 additional years (evaluated by the CSLC as a revision to the previously approved Project). The SEIR supplements the environmental analysis in the San Francisco Bay and Delta Sand Mining Project Environmental Impact Report (certified on October 19, 2012).

PROBABLE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS The Draft SEIR evaluates potential effects of the Revised Project on the environment in the following resource areas: Air Quality, Biological Resources, Cultural and Tribal Cultural Resources, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, Hydrology and Water Quality, Land Use and Recreation, and Mineral Resources. The Draft SEIR identifies significant and unavoidable impacts on Biological Resources. The Draft SEIR also evaluates potential effects on environmental justice communities and Public Trust uses and values, among other topics, pursuant to CSLC policies and guidelines.
