**RE: AB 1448 (California Coastal Protection Act)—SPONSOR**

Dear Assemblymember Hart,

The Center for Biological Diversity, Environmental Defense Center, and Oceana are pleased to sponsor Assembly Bill 1448 (AB 1448) to strengthen environmental protections, public oversight, and safety requirements for offshore drilling in California. With federal efforts to undermine state law and to expand and prolong offshore drilling while tapping into California's existing offshore oil infrastructure, we are at a pivotal moment for California to take definitive action to protect our public trust resources, ensure the vitality of our coastal economies, and support national security.

California's environment, coastal economies, and communities have been devastated by multiple oil spills associated with offshore drilling activities over the decades. The 2021 Huntington Beach, 2015 Refugio Beach, and 1969 Santa Barbara oil spills cumulatively resulted in the release of nearly 4.35M gallons of crude oil<sup>1,2,3</sup> which impacted more than 1,500 square miles of ocean

waters<sup>4,5,6</sup>—including marine protected areas—closed fisheries, and cost hundreds of millions of dollars in clean-up and damage costs.<sup>7</sup>

While another disastrous spill is always only a matter of time, this threat is exacerbated as California faces multiple efforts from the federal administration to expand offshore oil and gas extraction through new proposed lease sales in federal waters, enable offshore fracking, and bring back online aged, corroded infrastructure. First, the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management's 11th National Outer Continental Shelf Oil and Gas Leasing Program is advancing which proposes new lease sales in waters off California over the next five years (2027-2031). These proposed federal lease sales attempt to expand oil and gas drilling off California's coast using old, dangerous existing infrastructure despite the great risk to marine habitats, commercial fishing, tourism, and the state's economy. Second, the federal administration has also attempted to preempt California laws and disregarded a state court injunction that prohibit Sable Offshore Corp. from restarting the pipeline that was responsible for the disastrous oil spill at Refugio State Beach in 2015. Sable is currently pumping oil from offshore oil platforms and transporting oil through pipelines on and offshore Santa Barbara County without required state permits and in the face of a court injunction, felony charges for violating California's Water Code and Fish and Game Code, and an \$18M fine from the California Coastal Commission for defying state orders to stop work on the pipeline. Third, the Trump administration is fast-tracking a proposal to conduct fracking at a platform in the Santa Barbara Channel.

Waters off California's more than 3,000 miles of iconic coastline are an invaluable treasure to Californians, supporting globally significant epicenters of biodiversity, multi-billion-dollar fisheries and tourism-dependent businesses, military readiness, and irreplaceable resources of cultural and historical significance. Recognizing our inextricable connection and reliance on healthy and clean oceans, California has a long, bi-partisan history opposing expanded offshore oil and gas drilling off our coast. The state stopped issuing new offshore drilling leases in state waters after the historically devastating 1969 oil spill and made that policy permanent with the passage of the California Coastal Sanctuary Act of 1994. Additionally, no new offshore lease sales have occurred in federal waters off the state since 1984.

The 2015 oil spill led to new laws focused on reducing the risk of future spills. In 2015, AB 864 was signed into law mandating that owners of oil pipelines in California's coastal environmentally and ecologically sensitive areas use best available technology to reduce oil spill impacts. In 2018,

California enacted Senate Bill 834 (Chapter 309 of the Statutes of 2018) and Assembly Bill 1775 (Chapter 310 of the Statutes of 2018) to prohibit the State Lands Commission from entering into any new lease or other conveyance authorizing new construction of oil-and gas-related infrastructure on tidelands and submerged lands within state waters associated with Pacific Outer Continental Shelf leases issued after January 1, 2018. In 2025, the state passed a bill requiring a coastal development permit before idle pipelines and facilities are allowed to operate.

Additionally, the legislature has passed multiple resolutions over the years opposing expanded offshore oil and gas drilling off the state and objecting to California's inclusion in Outer Continental Shelf Oil and Gas Leasing Programs. Most recently Senate Joint Resolution 12 authored by Senator John Laird and 47 bi-partisan co-authors passed the Senate in March 2026, re-affirming California's support for protecting our communities, coastal economies, and environment from the impacts of expanded offshore oil and gas drilling and associated spills and opposes the U.S. Department of the Interior's draft proposed plan proposing new offshore oil and gas lease sales off the state. ACR 149 authored by Assemblymembers Gregg Hart, Dawn Addis, Steve Bennett, and 62 bi-partisan co-authors celebrates 50 years of coastal protection in California and highlights the required vigilance needed against federal expansion of offshore oil drilling to protect the state's coastal and ocean resources. California state leaders also fervently oppose expanded offshore drilling with pledges to safeguard California's ocean resources and local ocean economy from inclusion in any new federal lease sales from, among others: Governor Gavin Newsom, Lt. Gov. Eleni Kounalakis, California Fish and Game Commission, California Natural Resources Agency, 26 members of the California Congressional delegation, and the Pacific Fishery Management Council.

Local communities have also demonstrated their opposition to expanded offshore drilling with more than 80 municipalities across California adopting positions to stop such expansion, including nearly every coastal county in California. The majority of Californians also oppose expanded offshore drilling. According to polling conducted in July 2025 by the Public Policy Institute of California, 65% of California residents oppose more oil drilling off the California coast.<sup>8</sup> This is consistent with a national online poll<sup>9</sup> conducted for Oceana by the nonpartisan polling company Ipsos in July 2024 that found 66% of American voters in coastal states support their elected officials protecting U.S. coastlines from new offshore drilling. Furthermore, a 2024 national poll by Azul found that 72% of Latino voters support actions to ban offshore drilling for oil and natural gas, and instead utilize renewable fuels.<sup>10</sup>

Waters off California are a globally significant epicenter of biodiversity. These include migratory routes and feeding destinations for endangered humpback whales; nurseries for great white

sharks; breeding and foraging habitats for California sea lions, brown pelicans, and giant seabass; gardens of colorful deep-sea corals; and dense canopies of giant kelp forests. Waters off California are also home to five national marine sanctuaries—Greater Farallones National Marine Sanctuary, Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary, Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, Chumash Heritage National Marine Sanctuary, and Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary—a statewide network of 124 Marine Protected Areas,<sup>11</sup> one of nine Whale Heritage Areas in the world,<sup>12</sup> and other areas of conservation concern. Critical habitats have been designated for humpback whales, Southern Resident killer whales, Pacific leatherback sea turtles, green sea turtles, southern green sturgeon, and black abalone, with black abalone critical habitat extending along the central California coasts, including Farallon Islands, and around parts of the Channel Islands.<sup>13</sup> All waters off the coast of California up to 3,500 meters in depth are designated as Essential Fish Habitat under the Magnuson-Stevens Act,<sup>14</sup> and all seagrass, canopy kelp, rocky reefs, estuaries, and other areas of interest are designated as Habitat Areas of Particular Concern.<sup>15</sup> In 2024 and 2025, Oceana conducted a series of research expeditions documenting ocean biodiversity in waters surrounding California's Channel Islands. The first two expeditions alone identified more than 13,000 unique species using cutting edge environmental DNA analysis,<sup>16</sup> illuminating the need to better understand complex ocean ecosystems to create stronger and more effective wildlife protections.

California's marine economy supports more than 500,000 jobs and over \$51B in GDP,<sup>17</sup> which depends on a healthy, clean, and biodiverse ocean. According to a 2024 NOAA report, coastal tourism and recreation are the primary drivers for California's marine economy (producing 47% of GDP and 67% of employment), significantly outpacing that of offshore mineral resources (only 5% of GDP and 1% of employment). Expanding drilling would threaten the industries that sustain our coastal communities and risk national security, with little economic benefit.<sup>18</sup>

Consistent with the mission of the United States military to protect the American people and our homeland, waters off the California coast host a significant number of military installations, key logistics routes, and special use airspace. Offshore oil and gas development and associated spills could impede national defense activities.

Offshore oil infrastructure and the onshore pipelines that service their production are nearing or beyond the end of their economic and operational lifespan. Of the 27 oil platforms offshore California, 23 are located in federal waters, and four are located in state waters. Some are more

than 60 years old. The State of California has established strong goals to decrease greenhouse gas emissions, with substantial investments in renewable energy, climate action, and deliberate plans to move away from fossil fuels, especially offshore oil and gas drilling, to a more affordable, stable, and resilient clean energy economy. Of the four platforms in state waters, one is being decommissioned, and seven of the twenty-three platforms in federal waters are in various phases of decommissioning. California, now the fourth largest economy in the world, is on the right path to lead a clean coast economy.

Oil prices are set on a global market, influenced by factors beyond the state's control.<sup>19</sup> Expanded drilling offshore California could not produce enough to move global pricing—at its rosier projections it's just a drop in the bucket in the global supply market and will not lower gas prices today. Even production throughout the US—the world's largest producer—has not historically and cannot insulate consumers against global pricing volatility. Additionally, case studies demonstrate that expanding drilling will not significantly increase local supply. When a corroded pipeline in Santa Barbara County servicing the Santa Ynez Unit (SYU)—comprising of three offshore oil platforms connected to shore by offshore pipelines, onshore pipelines, the Ellwood Pier, mooring buoys, and the Las Flores Canyon Processing Facility—burst and spilled over 120,000 gallons of oil on May 19, 2015 the pipeline and the entire SYU remained idle for a decade. For the last full year of production, oil supply from the SYU averaged only 1.8% of total statewide crude oil supply, including domestic and foreign imports.<sup>20</sup> Additionally, looking at the period directly after the SYU went offline, there was no increase in foreign imports and in the time since did not significantly impact changes in foreign imports.<sup>21</sup> According to a 2025 report by Paasha Mahdavi, Associate Professor and Director of the Energy Governance and Political Economy Lab at UC Santa Barbara, "... well established economic models of oil supply and a statistical evaluation of the SYU show that (1) foreign imports are not likely to increase in the absence of SYU production and (2) restarting oil production will have limited to no impacts on California oil markets through 2045."<sup>22</sup> At the same time, oil spill risks to coastal communities and economies are tangible, serious, and significant.

At this critical time, AB 1448 would provide necessary safeguards to protect California's beloved beaches, globally significant ocean biodiversity, domestic fisheries, thriving coastal economies, and the health and safety of Californians. AB 1448 will strengthen environmental protections, public oversight, and safety requirements for offshore drilling in the following ways:

1. **Prohibit the use of existing oil infrastructure to expand federal oil production:** The bill builds on current law by enabling the state to stop projects that would expand federal drilling using existing leases and infrastructure in state waters.
2. **Strengthen state authority on leases:** The bill requires the State Lands Commission to consider additional factors before deciding whether to renew, modify, amend, extend, or transfer oil and gas infrastructure leases.
3. **Tighten gaps in California's offshore drilling ban:** The bill closes the last remaining loophole for leasing in state waters.

While California has already prohibited leases for new oil-and gas-related infrastructure to service oil extraction in federally leased waters (Pub. Res. Code section 6245) oil companies could attempt to use existing infrastructure to support new federal leases. To address this gap in state law, AB 1448 would prohibit the use of any existing infrastructure on tidelands or submerged lands within state waters that could service new drilling in federal waters after January 1, 2026. The bill will also prohibit the state from issuing new leases that would facilitate oil and gas production from nearby federal platforms through an extraction process known as slant or directional drilling. These provisions are consistent with California's long-standing bi-partisan opposition to expanded offshore drilling.

AB 1448 also adds considerations the State Lands Commission must evaluate before approving a lease renewal, extension, amendment, or modification, and it directs the Commission to evaluate these factors when considering any applications for assignments of leases as well. The newly added considerations are: impacts to trust resources and values, whether the infrastructure at issue has experienced a reportable incident (including oil spills), whether the request is related to unconventional oil drilling and production techniques, and whether the operator has provided finalized certificates of financial responsibility. AB 1448 also makes clear that commencing, increasing, intensifying, or restarting production from the Pacific Outer Continental Shelf constitutes an increase in the volume of oil and gas.

AB 1448 is a critical step to fortify the state against escalating risks of expanded offshore oil and gas drilling and associated spills.

The Center for Biological Diversity, Environmental Defense Center, and Oceana are the proud sponsors of AB 1448, and we look forward to working with you to enact this important legislation.

**RE: Assembly Bill 1448 (Hart) — SUPPORT**

Dear Pro Tem Limón and Chair Becker,

We join on behalf of the undersigned organizations, representing hundreds of thousands of Californians and thousands of businesses, in strong support of [AB 1448](#). This legislation is crucial to protect our state’s wildlife, coastal economy, and communities from the unprecedented threats from the federal efforts to expand offshore oil and gas drilling along the California coast, and the destructive legacy of pollution including oil spills. Our future is at risk, and we need you to stand up for the ocean and coast we love.

AB 1448 will safeguard our coast against disastrous impacts arising from federal efforts to expand offshore drilling through new lease sales—the first in over 40 years. The Trump Administration is currently advancing the [11<sup>th</sup> National Outer Continental Shelf Oil and Gas Leasing Program](#), which proposes new lease sales in waters off California. For more than 30 years, California has prohibited the use of state lands to support new oil and gas infrastructure. Now, these new proposed federal lease sales could expand oil and gas drilling off California’s coast using old, corroded and dangerous infrastructure, despite the great risk to marine habitats, commercial fishing, tourism, and the state’s multibillion dollar coastal economy. The draft 2026–2031 federal leasing program threatens to break a decades-long bipartisan halt of new offshore leasing off California. AB 1448 directly addresses that risk by prohibiting the use of existing infrastructure on state tidelands and submerged lands to support Pacific Outer Continental Shelf leases issued after January 1, 2026.<sup>1</sup>

Oil spills have historically caused significant damage to wildlife and marine habitats, leading to long-term environmental and economic harm. The 2021 Huntington Beach, 2015 Refugio Beach, and 1969 Santa Barbara oil spills cumulatively resulted in the release of nearly 4.35M gallons of crude oil which impacted more than 1,500 square miles of ocean waters — including marine protected areas — closed fisheries, and cost hundreds of millions of dollars in clean-up and damage costs. These spills off our coast are stark reminders of the need to decommission, not restart, antiquated infrastructure.

AB 1448 will also help guard against such disasters by strengthening public oversight and safety requirements for existing offshore drilling activities in California. The bill requires additional safeguards before changes to covered state-waters leases (including assignments) may be approved, particularly where changes could impact public trust resources and values, pertain to restarting production, involve unconventional drilling technologies, or relate to infrastructure that has experienced a reportable incident, such as an oil spill.

Over 150 million visitors enjoy California's coastlines every year. California's \$42 billion 'economic engine' and nearly 600,000 jobs rely on clean beaches and a healthy ocean. According to a [2024 NOAA report](#), coastal tourism and recreation produced 47% of GDP and 67% of the employment of California's marine economy. The coastal tourism and recreation sector, their employees, and their clients must be protected from the threat of another oil spill.

Polling<sup>2</sup> consistently demonstrates Californians highly value the protection of our climate, communities, and economy as paramount. AB 1448 supports California values by limiting greenhouse gases and pollution, including oil spills, that would result from expanded oil and gas production. It also protects vulnerable California communities that neighbor polluting oil processing plants and refineries. As the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management finalizes and releases its five-year offshore leasing program (including California lease sales), state action is urgently needed to protect California's iconic natural resources and ensure that public trust lands, state waters, and existing infrastructure are not used as a backdoor for new federal offshore drilling.

The future of California's coast faces an unprecedented threat in the coming months, and the outcome will determine its future for generations to come.

**We urge the Legislature to protect California from these federal threats of new oil and gas development, and we ask for your support to vote YES on AB 1448.**

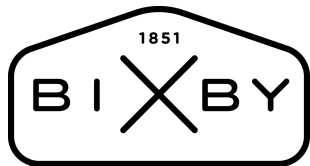

The following undersigned businesses and business associations write in strong support of AB 1448 (Hart) as amended. Many of us are members of the Business Alliance for Protecting the Pacific Coast (BAPPC). This Business Alliance represents more than 8,200 businesses across the Pacific Coast, including restaurants, hotels, retailers, tourism and recreation companies, real estate professionals, fishing organizations, Chambers of Commerce, Visitors Bureaus, outdoor brands, and small businesses whose livelihoods depend on a clean, healthy, and accessible coast. Our position is straightforward: **expanded offshore oil drilling is bad for business.**

AB 1448 is urgently needed as California's coastal economy faces a renewed federal push to expand offshore oil and gas leasing. For coastal businesses, this is not an abstract policy debate. Clean beaches, open harbors, healthy fisheries, thriving wildlife, and public confidence in a safe and accessible California shoreline are what brings customers to our visitor-serving businesses. Oil platforms, pipelines, and the inevitable risk of spills threaten the very assets that drive our coastal economy.

AB 1448 draws a necessary line by ensuring that California's state tidelands, submerged lands, and existing oil and gas infrastructure cannot be used as a backdoor to support new federal offshore drilling leases issued after January 1, 2026. Importantly, the bill does not prevent necessary repairs or maintenance of existing infrastructure for safety.

AB 1448 will also help guard against such disasters by strengthening public oversight and safety requirements for existing offshore drilling activities in California. The bill requires additional safeguards before changes to covered state-waters leases (including assignments) may be approved, particularly where changes could impact public trust resources and values, pertain to restarting production, involve unconventional drilling technologies, or relate to infrastructure that has experienced a reportable incident, such as an oil spill.

That accountability matters to business owners. Many of us have experienced firsthand the consequences when aging infrastructure fails. We know it is not only the operator that pays the price. Beach and fishing closures, cancelled events, lost reservations, reduced visitation, and reputational damage ripple through entire coastal communities and beyond.

California's marine economy is far more valuable as a clean coast economy than an expanded oil zone. NOAA data shows that California's marine economy supported more than 511,000 employees and generated \$51.3 billion in GDP, with tourism and recreation accounting for 67% of employment and 47% of GDP in the state's marine economy in 2024. California's beaches also receive more than 150 million visits each year. Those numbers reflect the core business reality: protecting the coast protects jobs, revenue, property values, local tax bases, and community prosperity for the long term. The same cannot be said for a finite and toxic resource.

AB 1448 is a practical, strategic, and strong response to the federal push to expand offshore oil drilling off California. It respects safety needs for existing infrastructure while preventing California's public trust lands and state-water infrastructure from being used to enable new federal offshore drilling. It strengthens transparency, improves accountability, and protects the coastal economy from risks that businesses cannot afford.

For these reasons, BAPPC, and the additional California businesses below, strongly support AB 1448 and urge the Legislature to vote **YES**. We also urge business owners across California's coast to stand with us. A clean coast is not only an environmental priority; it is our economic engine.

We represent the over 19,000 business leaders opposed to the expansion of offshore drilling and write to urge your support of AB 1448 (Hart) as amended. E2 and the Business Alliance for Protecting the Pacific Coast (BAPPC) collectively represent many business interests along the Pacific Coast including restaurants, hotels, retailers, tourism and recreation companies, real estate professionals, fishing organizations, Chambers of Commerce, Visitors Bureaus, outdoor brands, clean energy developers, and small businesses whose livelihoods depend on a clean, healthy, and accessible coast. Our position is straightforward: **expanded offshore oil drilling is bad for business.**

Assembly Bill 1448 is designed to protect the state's coast from new offshore oil and gas drilling. The bill blocks the expansion of federal offshore drilling by prohibiting the use of existing leases and infrastructure in state waters. In addition, it would strengthen oil pipeline safety requirements by mandating rigorous safety protocols and prohibit the use of pipelines that fail to meet all pipeline safety requirements. It would implement heightened coastal protections by requiring a new permit for the reactivation of oil and gas facilities that have been idle.

The state is now home to more than 552,000 clean energy workers and nearly 80 percent of all new energy jobs added last year were in clean energy. Additionally, our members are facing the impacts of warming oceans, rising seas, and increasingly disastrous weather patterns head on. While the economic benefits to a cleaner economy are clear, so are the economic costs of climate change. Since 1980, California has averaged at least one \$1 billion dollar-plus climate disaster every year. Last year's Los Angeles

wildfires alone cost an estimated \$62 billion and resulted in \$297 million in lost wages. AB 1448 will help California address the climate emergency threatening all Californians, while protecting coastal communities and millions of jobs.

AB 1448 is a practical, strategic, and strong response to the federal push to expand offshore oil drilling off California. It requires action to ensure safety for existing infrastructure while preventing California's public trust lands and state-water infrastructure from being used to enable new federal offshore drilling. It strengthens transparency, improves accountability, and protects the coastal economy from risks that businesses cannot afford.
