**NOTICE OF PUBLIC REVIEW AND INTENT TO ADOPT A
[MITIGATED] NEGATIVE DECLARATION**

(CEQA Guidelines, sections 15072 and 15073)

A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) has been prepared by the California State Lands Commission (CSLC), as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Pub. Resources Code, § 21000 et seq.) in response to an application submitted by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company for the Threemile Slough Pipeline Crossings Remediation and Decommissioning Project (Project). The MND was prepared in compliance with the requirements of CEQA, the CEQA Guidelines (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 15000 et seq.), and CSLC regulations (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 2, § 2901 et seq.).

Project Title: Threemile Slough Pipeline Crossings Remediation and Decommissioning Project

Project Location: The project is located across Threemile Slough near the northernmost point of Sherman Island and approximately 600 feet (upriver) of the Brannan Island State Recreation Area (SRA) boat launch ramp in Sacramento County, California.

Project Description: The California State Lands Commission will prepare a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project, which consists of the remediation of two active gas pipelines and removal of two inactive gas pipelines. The remediation work includes in-water placement of gravel and rock

over the two active pipelines to achieve the required minimum depth of burial of five feet of cover. The two inactive pipelines will be removed from the banks and bed of Threemile Slough. The underwater segments of the pipelines will be exposed using a crane-deployed submersible excavation pump with the removed sediment side-cast onto the bed of the slough. As the pipelines are exposed, a shear will be used to cut them into smaller segments that will be lifted onto a waiting barge. Removal of the pipelines will also require vegetation clearing and excavation into the waterside slopes of Brannan Island and Sherman Island. Work vessels and heavy equipment will be deployed from the home port CS Marine in Mare Island to the work area at Threemile Slough.
